

Now that you have acquainted yourself with the life and work of Sophie Taeuber-Arp, it is time to make some art yourself that is inspired by her style. Use whatever materials you have at home - any paper, pencils, markers, whatever you have!

Option One: As inspired by her architectural design and interior design, you are tasked with creating a blue print of your dream home, minimum of ten rooms. (Do not forget details like closets, windows, doors, stairs, porches, etc). Pick three rooms and design a carpet or wallpaper design, inspired by Sophie Taeuber-Arp's geometric abstract style. These patterns can be drawn on the same paper, or separate papers, depending on how much space you need.

Option Two: Create a diptych (two **SEPARATE** artworks that are displayed **TOGETHER**) that are both abstract collages (a collage is an artwork where pieces of paper and other items are glued down in a new composition). They should be inspired by the shapes and compositions seen in Sophie Taeuber-Arp's abstraction period. While each collage should be different from the other, there should be some elements that connect them together, whether it is a repeated shape, pattern, line, or color. Feel free to use newspapers, magazines, recycling items, **WHATEVER** you have. Each collage should have a minimum of 13 pieces attached to your paper.
